Latest Security Thought Leadership Podcasts

We have now released sixteen episodes in our "Security Thought Leadership" podcast series, with each speaker offering unique insights into the security industry and its future. The latest two episodes feature interviews with ex-offender Terry who was drawn into crime but eventually started a new life; and Bob Martin, the 2024 UK OSPAs Lifetime Achievement winner and the first ever entrant to the Security Hall of Fame.

Terry

This podcast offers a chilling insight into the world of crime, told through the story of Terry, an ex-offender. Terry didn't think there was anything inevitable in his early childhood that would lead to him to become a persistent priority offender by his mid-teens. Drawn in by older boys and the high rewards of fraud, theft, and commercial burglary, he saw little value in legitimate pursuits. He never found the counsellors appointed to help him realistic. Eventually he ended up in prison and there developed a drug habit that governed the next stage of his life. On his release, his crimes were driven by the need to pay for drugs. Shoplifting was more lucrative than many alternatives and carried less risks, and drug dealing provided him with access to what he most valued. Nine more prison sentences followed, and then, when he decided enough was enough, drug barons took exception and he suffered multiple stab wounds. He decided to help the police, joined witness protection and started a new life. Listen to how Terry ended up, the hard way, as a head chef.

Bob Martin

Bob Martin has over 35 years of experience in the petrochemical industry and has worked in a diverse range of business operational environments before establishing a specialisation in security. He brings with him a range of skills, including strategy development, integration, management systems, data management, and, crucially, the importance of the 'value add' proposition and the need to demonstrate a profit. He has worked extensively as a security consultant. In this podcast, Bob discusses insights from a career that started in business and culminated in taking a lead in global security. Specifically, he talks about the challenges for security in making a meaningful contribution to the bottom line, the steps that still need to be taken for security to be recognised as a profession, the limitations of security associations in spearheading change, and why security has failed to sufficiently influence the C-Suite.

Bill Fox

Our **next episode** comes out on **Monday 4th November** with Bill Fox. Bill is internationally renowned for his knowledge and expertise in violence risk reduction. As Founder and Executive Chairman of Maybo a company he started 28 years ago he has inspired innovative approaches to reducing violence at work, including the recently launched *Workplace Violence Reduction Awards* (WVRAs). In this podcast Bill discusses the different forms of violence that are taking place in different types of workplaces that generate the need for different types of responses. You will hear him lament the Zero Tolerance approach; highlight the crucial role of managers in preventing workplace violence; and explain how and when safe interventions are possible.
